

# **2025-2026** Independent Verification Worksheet (V1, V5)

Your 2025-2026 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called Verification. Federal law requires the CCTC Financial Aid Office to compare the information from your FAFSA with copies of your 2023 IRS Federal tax returns or other financial aid documents. This process is required before awarding federal student aid.

- Bring this worksheet both completed and signed to the Financial Aid Office on your campus. *Attach any required documentation*.
- You may submit a signed copy of your 2023 Federal income tax return. To request a copy of your 2023 Tax Return Transcript and/or W-2 Form(s), contact the Internal Revenue Services at IRS.GOV.
- The Financial Aid Office may ask you for additional information or documentation. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may be corrected by the Financial Aid Office.

- 2. You **became married** after filing your 2023 taxes but before you signed the FAFSA.

**Note**: If you were **married** on or before December 31, 2023—your tax filing status must reflect 'Married Filing Joint' or 'Married Filing Separately' on the tax return/transcript. If you were **separated** on or before December 31, 2023—valid documentation must be submitted to verify separation in order for a filing status of 'Single' or 'Head of Household' to be accepted and for amendment of taxes not to be required. If you had an **amended tax return**, you must also submit a copy of the Amended Tax Return (1040X).
